



- 3 – subheadings (reading, writing, etc)
- 4 – actual standards that teachers will be entering scores for.

Sortorder:

Works together with **Level**.

- Mark the sort order of the 1 item at level 1 as 1.
- Mark the sort order of all items at level 2 as 1, 2, 3, etc.
- Mark the sort order of all items at level 3 as 1, 2, 3, etc.
- Mark the sort order of all items at level 4 as 1, 2, 3, etc.
